

Minutes from convened meeting of all inter  
Boat-owners held 17<sup>th</sup> March 65 in the  
Borough Council Chambers. 26 persons attended.

meeting at 8.15<sup>am</sup> and outlined his reasons  
for calling a meeting to form a Boating Club.  
Several other speakers outlined the benefits  
boat owners would receive if a club were  
formed. Mr Fowler formally moved that

was later amended to £1. Passed.

It was moved that the name of the club  
be (Patea and Districts Boating Club) Passed.

The Secretary was instructed to write  
to the Marine Dept to obtain pamphlets  
boating safety, rescue and general reg  
ulations also a letter to the Borough  
council to inform them that a Boating  
Club had been formed and to ask

a meeting between our committee and the  
councillors down at the ramp to discuss  
proposed development etc.

After a general discussion the following  
suggestions are to be brought up at the  
Annual Meeting.

- ① Safety & Rescue Measures.
- ② Radio Home Base (Amateur Radio Corps.)
- ③ Purchase of dingy and lifesaving gear.
- ④ Boat owners carrying Distress flags & rockets.
- ⑤ Tractor for hauling out boats.

The Chairman thanked everyone for  
their attendance and the meeting was  
closed at 9 50 am.

It was moved Goodman seconded Lord. That  
Mr Fowler be reimbursed expenses involved in  
advertising meeting. Passed.
